



Background of the Project

Since the signing of the Framework Agreement on the Bangsamoro (FAB), it has been envisioned that the conflicts in Mindanao which have been on-going for more than 40 years will finally be resolved with the establishment of the Bangsamoro Government. In order for that peace in the Bangsamoro area to be consolidated and stable enough to prevent the recurrence of the conflict, one of the key factors will be how the people find the difference from the past in terms of functioning of the new autonomous government in which the capacity as well as the attitude of the new government officers are decisive apart from the political right of the people to self-determination.



Hiroshima University has been conducting researches and activities of peacebuilding in Mindanao from 2006, while Hiroshima Prefectural Government joined the former in supporting Bangsamoro peace in 2012. As institutions for peace, both of them are now determined for contributing to the peace through training the youths of the region to be capable and efficient candidates to serve for the people and the government of the Bangsamoro.

The Project

1. The 5th Hiroshima Essential Training (JULY, 2017)

- 1.1 12 youths aged approximately between 20 and 30 will be invited to the 5th Hiroshima Essential Training for a duration of 4 weeks. The trainees shall learn professional knowledge and practical skills in public administration and be evaluated their performance.
- 1.2 Higher capacity to execute the practical public administration shall be demonstrated by the trainees by producing policy proposals for the Bangsamoro Government at the end of the trainings and submitting them to Bangsamoro Development Agency, the local project partner.
- 1.3 The training will be interactive so that the contents will be reviewed and adjusted to the local needs .
- 1.4 Excellent trainees of Hiroshima Essential Trainings will have an opportunity to enhance their capacity by participating the Mindanao Hiroshima Skill-up Trainings, subject to the continuation of this project.

2. Training also at Davao Selective Seminar (MAY, 2017)

All the applicants will be subject to the first selection on the basis of their application documents. 33 youths selected through documentary selection will be invited to Davao to obtain basic knowledge and skills of peacebuilding. It is those 12 best performers in this Selective Seminar who will be invited to Hiroshima.

3. Sustainable Learning and Human Network to Support the Bangsamoro Government

- 3.1. An alumni association of the Hiroshima trainees will be organized to support the Autonomous government across various fields.
- 3.2. Mini Library in Cotabato releases the training materials and related documents to the public.
